I Will Comfort You

Almost every child (or former child!) knows the feeling of a mother’s comfort. From the hungry cries of the newborn, to the scraped knees of the gradeschooler who’s fallen off a skateboard, to the injured pride of the highschooler who’s just lost the campus election, to the broken heart of the young person who’s just been dumped, even to the broken spirit of the adult, perhaps, who has learned what it is to truly suffer on behalf of his or her own children, we never outgrow the longing for that motherly consolation. We just don’t forget the feeling of those arms wrapped around us, the sense that all will be well and that we’re always beloved in spite of our pains.

So Isaiah’s characterization of Jerusalem as Mother (from today’s first reading) is provocative: The LORD promises the people that “as nurslings you shall be carried in [Jerusalem’s] arms.” And even more profoundly, Isaiah shows God speaking of God’s very self as a mother: “For thus says the LORD [...] as a mother comforts her child, so I will comfort you.” Frankly, the image of God as a mom may seem strange, even though it’s a strong undercurrent throughout our scriptures and traditions. But what’s interesting to me here isn’t just the comfort, which is precious on its own, but also the *results* of that comfort. Isaiah promises God’s people that they’ll find motherly comfort in Jerusalem, and that when they do, their “hearts shall rejoice” and their “bodies flourish like the grass; the LORD’s power shall be known to his servants.” What better way to know God’s power than to experience God’s comfort as we did our mothers’ comfort, or as we give it now to our loved ones?

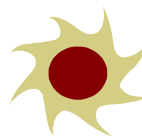
