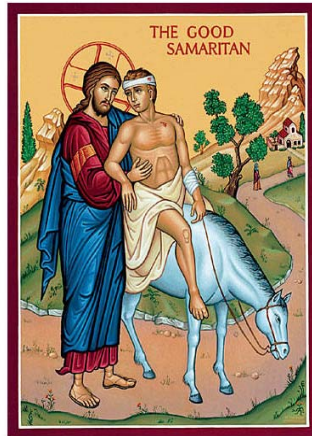

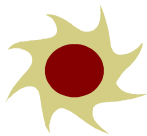

A Measure of Mercy

A story is told of two men who go to the same church. The first man stood at the altar and prayed about himself: “God, I thank you that I am not like other men – hustlers, people who do bad things, men who think lustful thoughts of women – or even like this other fellow. I fast twice a week and give a tenth of all I earn.” But the second man stood his distance. He would not even look up at God, but beat his chest and said, “God, have compassion on me, an offender.”

Which man, in your opinion, would be most likely to show compassion to someone who was injured, hungry and/or lost?

Today’s Gospel reading in Luke directs us to the hard truth that genuine compassion and mercy come most often from those who have discovered that the false façade of pride and arrogance mask a deeper awareness of just how desperate our situation would be if not for the compassion and mercy shown by God. Without God’s compassion we too might have ended up in the proverbial ditch stripped, beaten and left for dead.

The parable told by Jesus to the scholar reveals the true nature of human compassion as a humility born out of gratitude for the knowledge that God did not just pass by but stopped, took pity on us and tended to our wounds.
